Somerset Dowsers visit to Crediton and area with Peter Knight

Half a dozen of us DDs joined five Somerset Dowsers for a tour around the St. Michael line in the Crediton area led by well known tour guide, author and dowser Peter Knight.

The morning was spent at Colebrooke Church which is on the Michael line and has interesting energies, serpents and a green man.

One energy line is marked in the cobbles by a continuous cobble line to the church entrance. Also on the line were energy node points.

To the right of the main entrance is a small door with a coffin shaped stone in front which has an energy line running through its centre to a Yew tree in the churchyard. To either side are two more energy lines. Also to the right of the main entrance and around the corner is another doorway with two stones either side of the entrance which have energy lines going through them.

On the way to Crediton and lunch we stopped at the Celtic Cross in Copplestone where we found eight energy lines coming from the cross: four from each face and four from each diagonal corner. The energy bands are marked in the Cross.

In the afternoon we visited the Holy Cross Church in Crediton where Peter pointed out the hidden symbolism of the stained-glass windows and the true meaning and origins. The church is one of the crossing or nodal points of the Michael and Mary energy currents, so we then spent some time confirming that the Mary earth energy line ran up the centre of the church with the Michael line coming in from the St. Michael Chapel. There were energy node points throughout the church with the highest energy point in front of the altar. The pulpits gave off an uplifting energy which was (and felt) quite different to the sides of the pulpits. A fountain of energy was coming out of the Font and there was an energy field below the Green Man.

After this we visited a small Holy Well called St. Libbett's (a Well new to us even though we've lived near here for 27 years), and then finished the day by visiting the St Boniface statue and Holy Well in the nearby park. At this Well the Mager Rosette responded to the white segment (Holy Water) which didn't surprise us at all. We finished the day by standing around the Well, laying our hands on it and sending healing out to the world.

Many thanks to Peter for his time, knowledge and patience and to Somerset Dowsers for making us so welcome.
